Blood Donors are True Lifesavers

NCCBB has the best donors in the world! We would like to take this opportunity to thank all of our wonderful donors for their generosity. We collected 12,599 whole Blood units, 1,145 Platelets products and 1463 Plasmas this year. We had 3,760 first time donors, 864 blood drives, using three bloodmobiles. That is 21,000 cups of juice and 24,183 cookies.

Each year the need for blood goes up. Unfortunately, so does the number of reasons donors are unable to give. It is because of you, our wonderful donors, that we continue to meet the need of Humboldt and Del Norte Counties and the 6 hospitals that we service. Our donors, you, are in the top percentile in the country for the average number of donations per year. The national average is 1.9; your's is 2.5 times a year. We are very lucky to have such generous donors, thank you!!!

In September, one of our employees was faced with the reality of how important donating blood is, as an emergency need hit her family. Deanna Vallee was working at a blood drive in Ferndale when she got a call from her family that her dad, Al Braud, who went in for a routine procedure was not doing well. When she got to the hospital, she learned that her dad was in ICU and was receiving blood transfusions. It was a very scary time for Deanna and her family. Al used 8 units of blood and 1 platelet product as well as several rounds of cell saver blood. Today Al is doing great, and he enjoyed a wonderful holiday with his family. Deanna said it was a really good feeling to know that she may have drawn the blood that saved her Dad's life.

Thank you for being the best donors in the world. We look forward to 2005 together.

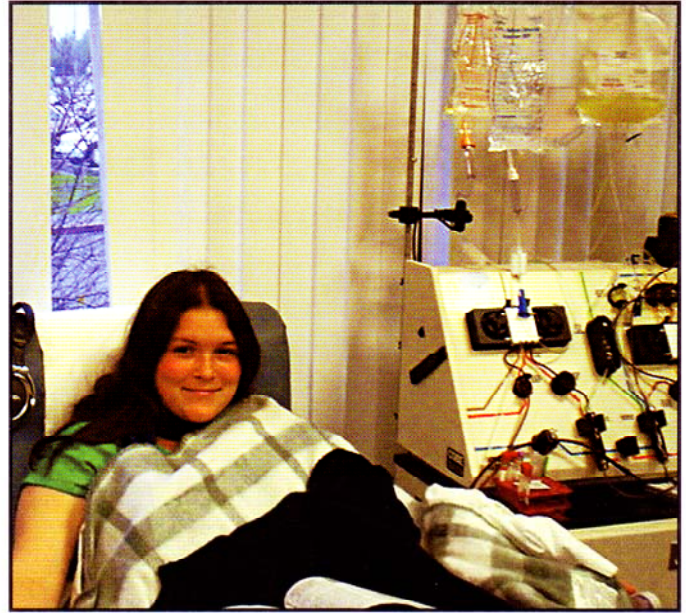
Sticky Business

The need for platelets is going up. Platelets are the "sticky" part of your blood that helps you clot. They are used in open-heart surgeries and with cancer patients. They are very fragile and need to be handled with great care. They need to be kept at room temperature, and they only last five days after they are collected.

I recently sat down with Elaine Hogan while she was donating platelets for the first time. I wanted to know why she had decided to donate platelets. She said: "Lots of people need them. My Grandma used to donate, so now I do it for her." I asked her if donating was what she expected. She said "It was far better than what I thought it would be. I was a little nervous beforehand. It is just a step up from donating plasma; you get more blankets and a movie." When I asked Elaine if she would do it again, she said: "There is no reason not to. It is easy and it benefits a lot of people." Thank you Elaine for taking a chance on platelets and saving a life!!!! Donating platelets takes about two hours, but

all you have to do is sit back, relax and enjoy a movie. You will have a nurse right there to get you whatever you need. We need 10 donors a day to meet our needs. Please call Dessie at the Blood Bank to get more information and to set up your appointment. We have early morning thru late evening appointments available.

Lastly, we give you a few cookies, a soda, juice, or a cup of coffee for your trouble. You've given us 30 to 60 minutes of your time, more if you are an apheresis donor, and all you get is some cookies and juice. And, soon thereafter, we call you up and ask you to do it again.

Your dedication and your altruism for the patients we all serve together is truly remarkable. I have been working for blood centers since 1980, and I am continually awed by the dedication and commitment of blood donors.

I am thankful everyday for the work we get to do at the blood bank. We act as the middleman for the gift from you, the donors, to the patients who need you. I have known many people who have used blood in the past, even family members, but it was made personal again this past summer for me and my family. On behalf of the Schallert family, and on behalf of all patients who need your gift of life and their families, thank you.

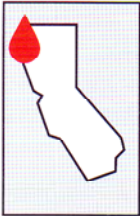
